Sample article: Rembrandt Harmensz van Rijn (1607-1669)



Rembrandt Harmensz van Rijn (Ryn), probably the greatest painter of the Western world, was born 15 July 1607 at Leiden, and died 4 October 1669 at Amsterdam. In an age when the tradition of Christian painting had been practically abandoned in the Netherlands under the influence of the Dutch Reformed spirit, Rembrandt devoted about one third of his life's work to the depiction of Biblical scenes. Contrary to the trend of contemporary art, in which the "genre" picture, still life, and seascapes predominated, he founded a new style of interpretation of the Bible. To be sure, the young painter frequently drew his themes from the Bible because of the wealth of dramatic material found there, especially in the Old Testament. But after the death of his wife Saskia in 1642 an increasing religious sincerity becomes evident in Rembrandt's work. Especially his etchings and drawings (there are about 600 of these showing Biblical scenes) show Rembrandt's reactions to the message of the Gospel.

Officially Rembrandt was a member of the Reformed Church, and as yet there has been no evidence that he severed this connection in spite of serious conflicts with the church council, such as the exclusion of Hendrickje Stoffels from communion in 1653, who lived with him after his wife's death. Nevertheless there is some indication that Rembrandt was in close contact with Mennonite circles and from them received essential religious motivations.

The Global Mennonite Encyclopedia Online began in 1996 as a project of the Mennonite Historical Society of Canada (under the name Canadian Mennonite Encyclopedia Online). It was intended to be a dynamic source of information about the Anabaptist-Mennonite groups in Canada. It emerged from a congregational database created by Marlene Epp for the three-volume *Mennonites in Canada* history series. Later the Society obtained permission from Herald Press in Scottdale, PA to copy and modify entries of the four-volume *Mennonite Encyclopedia* published in the 1950s, and a supplemental fifth volume published in 1990. In 2005 two partners -- the Mennonite Brethren Historical Commission and the Mennonite Church USA Historical Committee -- joined the project, and expanded it to become a English-language Global Anabaptist Mennonite Encyclopedia Online (GAMEO). Mennonite Central Committee joined the partnership in early 2006 and Mennonite World Conference in January 2007.

The project in time will include the full text of the print *Mennonite Encyclopedia*, and will add new content both from North America and around the world. Additional partners will be added as possible, and content in non-English languages is possible at a future time. Because of this expansion it was necessary to move to a new website, devoted entirely to GAMEO.

Articles in GAMEO are assigned and editorially reviewed before upload; GAMEO is not a "Wiki"-style project. Encyclopedia subjects include, but are not limited to, history, statistics, biography, education, the arts and family history. The Encyclopedia Search provides for a word or phrase search on the Encyclopedia's content, or browsing an alphabetical index.

If you have corrections or suggestions for an encyclopedia article, please contact the Managing Editor. Be specific in your comments and give the exact name/address of the article (this can be copied from the bottom of each article).

Who We Are

We, the families and single residents of the Rocky Cape Christian Community, come from various places around the world. Some of us live here on a permanent basis, others are here for a time. Some of us grew up in Christian homes, others did not.

Together we form an Anabaptist (Hutterite) community, baptising believers on confession of faith, holding our goods in common, and choosing non-violence as followers of Christ.

While we have close and direct links to other Anabaptist communities like ours, we seek fellowship with all serious believers regardless of their background or credentials—that know Christ and follow him. We accept the baptism, church order, and witness of other groups beside our own.

A number of us at Rocky Cape belong to families that fled for their faith from Switzerland, Austria, and Germany during the 1500s. From there, we found our way through Eastern Europe to America and Australia. But this is only one detail of a much more involving story that began with . . .

A Strange Assignment Long Ago

"You will receive power," Jesus told a small group of friends that followed him to sunny heights above Galilee, "when the Holy Spirit comes on you. And you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judaea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Then he was taken up before their eyes and a cloud hid him from their sight.

The little group stood and stared.

Only a short while before this Jesus had told them the secret of the Kingdom of God (Mark 4:11). They had just begun to know what that kingdom included and who would belong to it. But of the "ends of the earth" they knew nothing—nor how to get there. Much less of the people or a place on the other side of the world called . . .

Tangdimmaa

On bare feet, swift but sure, the first people at Tangdimmaa clambered up the rocks to caves high above the surf. Watchful mothers that lived in the caves loved their children—lithe woolly-haired boys and girls that romped about them with quick wide smiles—on foraging trips to the sea. But to feed them posed a daily challenge, and for this they depended on the men and grown boys at Tangdimmaa.

All winter long, after short-tailed shearwaters had flown, and storms drove the waves in night-long thunder onto rocks below, the men of Tangdimmaa hunted possums and kangaroo. Far into the dripping bush they followed cushioned trails under tea trees and towering gums. Raucous birds told them where berries had turned


